### REPORT

The Department of Geography, St. Xavier's College, Burdwan organized its second session of Master Class Lecture Series on November 4, 2023 (Saturday). The invited speaker for the session was Dr. Indrajit Roy Chowdhury, Assistant Professor, Department of Geography and Applied Geography, North Bengal University. The title of the Master Class was '*Indigenous Tribes of Sub-Himalayan North Bengal: An Unexplained Story about the Livelihood Experiences*'. The academic programme was held in the Seminar Hall of the Academic Building from 12 noon addressing 65 participating students.

The inauguration of the programme was marked by watering the plant by Dr. Indrajit Roy Chowdhury, the speaker for the session, one of the teacher representative along with a student representative. Thereafter, the speaker was introduced and felicitated by the Head of the Department.

The Master Class began with understanding of indigenous livelihoods of the tribes of North Bengal. Dr. Roy Chowdhury with his extensive, empirical, ethnographic study for eight long years in the North Bengal shared his experiences about their unique life worlds. His vivid description was accompanied with evocative visual representations of indigenous livelihood. His lecture focused on how the tribal community have adopted with the sub-Himalayan natural habitat; the ways in which their life worlds are coping with rapid urbanization; how they are using home-stay tourism to maintain their economy in a ecologically sustainable way and the problems they encounter because of the accessibility issues.

The Master Class session was followed by the interactive session where the participating students were curiously enquired about the influences of urbanism and tourism in the serene tribal lives. Dr. Roy Chowdhury encouraged young minds to visit the untrodden sites of sub-Himalayan Bengal and explore their cultural realms.

The second Master Class was a successful attempt as the participants were encouraged on various dimensions of Geography of Culture and Tourism. The knowledge acquired through this learning session would definitely be utilized for their future academic pursuits.


